Enhanced 9-1-1 Compliance Grant Program

A Building Communities Grant Overview

It is the intent of the General Assembly that the Enhanced 9-1-1 Compliance Grants Program shall cease to exist on June 30, 2021. Funding is currently set at \$400,000.00. The Enhanced 9-1-1 Board shall award grants either until the current funding is expended or until 6/30/21, whichever comes first.

The Enhanced 9-1-1 Compliance Grant Program was created by Act 160 of the 2016 legislative session. This Building Communities grant is intended to provide financial assistance and incentive to Vermont schools to support the identification and implementation of needed changes to the school's telecommunications technology so accurate address and location information (i.e., specific call back number, building name/number, floor number, room number, etc.) is provided to Vermont 9-1-1 in the event of an emergency.

This program is administered by the Vermont Enhanced 9-1-1 Board which has the authority to award grants at its sole discretion. Grants are awarded competitively. The program is authorized to award matching grants of up to \$25,000.00 per project. For projects involving multi-school phone system integration, each school may be considered as a separate project for the purposes of this application. The required match must be through dollars raised and not in-kind services.

It is important to recognize that each school may have a different starting point on the path to compliance with 9-1-1 location requirements. While the ultimate goal is to have all schools provide the required information, this grant program will support schools in taking any needed steps along the path toward compliance. Examples of projects that will be considered for these grants include but are not limited to: fees/costs for consultation services to identify current telecommunications system capabilities; fees/costs associated with consultation services to understand available options and/or obstacles related to improving the quality of information sent to 9-1-1; fees associated with improving a school's ability to maintain accurate location data; and/or costs for replacing or upgrading existing telecommunications technology to allow for more accurate location information.

Grant applications for public schools must be coordinated and submitted at the Supervisory Union or School District level on behalf of individual schools.

Independent schools that receive public funds for tuition are also eligible for this program and may submit applications on their own behalf.

Please note: It is the intent of the legislature that applicants applying for any of the Building Communities Grant Awards shall not apply for more than one grant as defined in Chapter 137 of Title 24 for the same project in a single calendar year, in any category. This does not prohibit organizations from requesting funding for a different project in an alternate location under any of the grants.

New Requirements – Effective July 1, 2019

The Vermont Enhanced 9-1-1 Board recently adopted a rule governing the 9-1-1 requirements for ECS (Enterprise Communications Systems) previously known as Multi-Line Telephone Systems. This rule went into effect July 1, 2019.

In addition to providing clarification on previously existing requirements, this new Rule requires that **“ECS end users shall have the ability to directly initiate a call to 9-1-1 without dialing any additional digit, code, prefix or post-fix.”**

**Enhanced 9-1-1 Compliance Grant Program
Fall 2019 Application Instructions**

Grant applications for public schools must be coordinated and submitted at the Supervisory Union or School District level on behalf of individual schools.

Independent schools that receive public funds for tuition are also eligible for this program and may submit applications on their own behalf.

Purpose: Funds are to be used to identify, implement, and/or maintain changes to a school's telecommunications system technology so the most accurate call back and dispatchable location information is available to a 9-1-1 call-taker in the event a 9-1-1 call is placed from the school's telephone system.

Eligibility: This grant program is open to all Vermont public pre-K-12 schools and Vermont independent pre-K-12 schools that receive public funds for tuition. Grants are not available for locations that house only administrative offices, i.e., the project must impact facilities that routinely house a student population. Grants are provided for projects that are ready to begin or are currently in progress. Projects that are already completed are not eligible.

Award Limits and Financial Match Documentation: The maximum available grant is \$25,000.00 per project. For projects involving multi-school phone system integration, each school may be considered as a separate project for the purposes of this application. Requests in any amount up to the twenty-five-thousand-dollar limit will be considered. A letter from the supervisory union or school district authority confirming the existence of the required financial match must be included in the application package. In-kind services may not be used as the match source.

Required Documentation: Each grant application *must* have a quote/estimate attached that provides specific details about the work to be done and the cost of the project.

Application Deadline: All applications and supporting material must be received by the Vermont Enhanced 9-1-1 Board by **4:30 PM on Friday, 1 November 2019**. Applications may be submitted by e-mail or by US mail.

Evaluation Process: Grant applications will be reviewed by a committee of staff members from the Vermont Enhanced 9-1-1 Board. A supplemental risk assessment questionnaire will be required prior to final award offer. Award notifications will be made in writing on or before 20 December 2019.

- Detailed Project Description** - *Note: Grant funds are awarded on a competitive basis. Each application must contain a comprehensive and detailed description of the work to be performed along with an itemized estimate/quote for the project. The description should include a detailed statement regarding the impact of the work on the ability of the school's telephone system to provide accurate and specific location information to a 9-1-1 call-taker. If this project is dependent upon a multi-school phone system integration, details should be provided in this section. This statement is an integral part of the evaluation committee's grant award determination process.*

- Financial Match Documentation:** The application packet *must* include a signed letter from the supervisory union or school district authority confirming the existence of a sufficient financial match for the grant amount requested. As a reminder, in-kind contributions of labor and/or materials or other types of in-kind match are not allowed.
